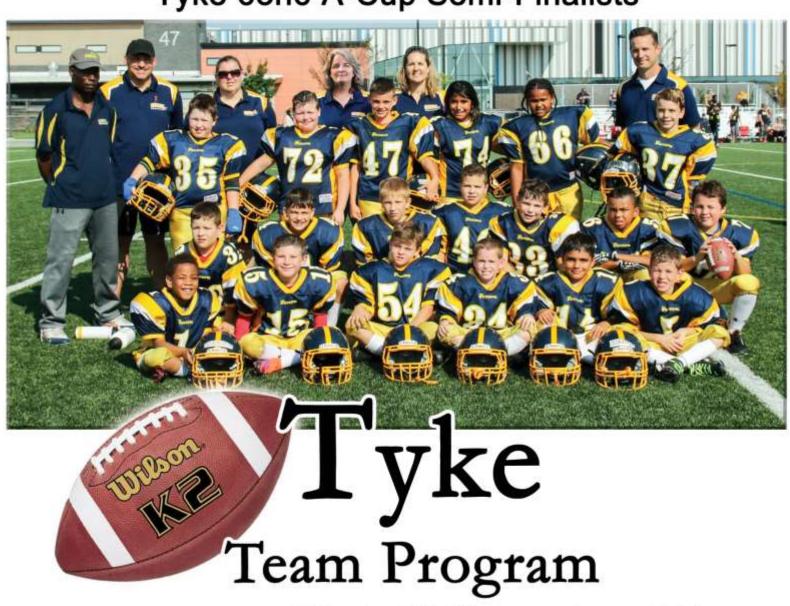

2017 Tyke Coach's Message



As with every new season, we started with a big mix of new and old. With the 2017 changes in NCAFA, we had more new than old. We started the season with 4 "veteran" players and whole group of excited first timers. As the coaching team, we looked at this season to be a "building" year; one where the athletes will learn the basics of football, learn what it meant to be part of a team, and most importantly have fun. The season started with conditioning and the basics. However, the real fun began on the first night of equipment. Both players and their parents were excited to be outfitted: getting the team's pads in the right place etc. It was a learning point for the players and their parents. Once the players took to the field; week after week, we saw the change. They started as individuals and ended as a team.

As the season progressed the team grew. They grew as individuals, as team mates and as friends. During games, we saw the players that were not on the field cheering on their team mates, concerned if one took a knee, rejoiced in our scores, and yes even showed disappointment when the other teams scored. Our offense had great depth. With a few veterans mixed with some first timers, we were able to put points on the board every game. Our first game we lost by only 8 points, our second by only 6 and then we won our first game. We scored an average of 32 points per regular season game and our fans loved it. Offense is the more technical side of the game. A team has to learn many plays and be able to execute them. If one goes left and they were supposed to go right, then the play falls apart. One of those plays was the famous "fumblerooski" that even drew comments from the opposing teams complaining that they could not stop it, our response "once you stop it, we will use something else".

Our defence was another story. With 2 veterans, they had their work cut out for them. Defence is not as technical as offence but it is just as important. The difference is, the defence have a job to do, without knowing what the other team's offence is planning, so a lot of the defence has to do with "reacting". We spent lots of time teaching the whole team the basics of a good/clean/effective tackle. We spent many nights using the tackle donut to make sure they all learned the safe way to tackle then we progressed to man to man.

Throughout the season, the players became a team. We ended the regular season in third place and went on to the playoffs. Our quarter final game was an easy one for us. The team worked hard, executed on the plays. Offense put the points on the board, and Defence held the other team at bay. Our semi-final game was a tough game for us, thus ended our season. What was hard to see for us coaches, was the reaction of the team. Learning to be an athlete means to learn how to win and how to lose. Losing this last game was tough for all of us and some of our players took it to heart. This showed us that they all cared. We worked hard all season and we made it to the playoffs, but the tears at the end showed the amount of heart each and every one on that field had played with.

After our first practice, we as coaches said "Well, this will be a learning year for this team", then once it got going we said, "This team is going to surprise us" and so they did. We as coaches were proud to work with each and every one of 2017 Bell Warriors Tyke team and look forward to a great 2018! Warriors for Life!

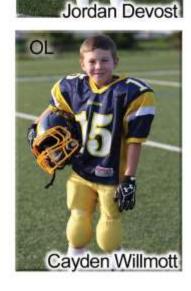
