# 2011 Bantam Coach's Message

We would also like to extend our best wishes to our graduating players – you hopefully leave our program with some lessons learned about team-work, effort, sportsmanship, and determination – the sort of life-lessons that can be applied to whatever you do in your future. On a personal note, I would like to extend my sincere thanks to the 2011 Bantam coaches. You all put in long hours in all sorts of weather and remained positive throughout the year. The players feed off the coaches attitudes and so it's very important that they see a cohesive group of adults.

To all the returning players, 2012 is going to be a good year. With the sort of effort you showed in 2011 combined with another strong core of graduating Pee Wee players, you should once again be contending for the "A" Cup.
