2012 Mosquito Coach's Message



The 2012 Bell Warrior Mosquito Team was a process and experience I will never forget. I continue to look back and be amazed on how these young men sacrificed and committed to each other unlike no other team I have ever seen.

When you begin such an undertaking, you can never be quite sure of how it will evolve or grow. We had assembled a great team of volunteer coaches and managers that shared a common vision, the heart of which stated <u>our team would work harder than any other team out there</u>. Having a vision and writing it down is one thing. Getting 34 young men to accept that vision is entirely another matter. The moment the coaches and I knew we had a special group was when this acceptance took hold. The kids responded. We ran sprints more than any other team. We challenged the boys to work on their off days and we could see they were. The moment that stands out, as a shining example of this hard work and conditioning, was Shane Forsyth running down a bigger faster running back 45 yards to save a touchdown. I knew then we had something special.

As the season progressed, and the victories mounted, our biggest challenge was to keep the team working at a high level. We soon adopted the mantra of practicing as if we hadn't won a game yet. Once again the boys responded. They worked harder as the season progressed **despite** their success! We kept saying work hard and good things will happen and we were right.

An <u>Undefeated Season</u> is a special and rare thing. Reflecting upon it now, I firmly believe it was what each player expected of themselves and each other. Many more talented teams (the coaches and I have been associated with) did not come close to this. The difference on this team is that they did this, not for personal glory, not for stats and not for all-star teams. They accomplished this for each other. When players decide to play for each other above all else, they become unstoppable.

The last thing I said to this team (in an emotional victory speech) was *remember this day!!* Remember that when times get tough and you get knocked down, get up and work harder. For me, the 2012 Bell Warriors Mosquito Team will be my own personal reminder to do so. On behalf of the entire 2012 Mosquito Staff thank you for an unforgettable year.




